




MAP OF THE CITY







Welcome

Welcome to the 2012 Meeting of the Glaucoma Research Society in Würzburg. Many of us participated in the last GRS Meeting in Kyoto, Japan 2010, under a new format with focused discussions of selected important glaucoma subjects. We are convening this year in Würzburg, a 400 year old University town where Conrad W. Roentgen discovered X-rays and Rudolf Virchow developed the field of cellular pathology. The University Eye Hospital, founded in 1857, has a long tradition of excellent glaucoma care and research. Albrecht von Graefe was a frequent visitor during its early decades.

The Program Committee, chaired by Claude Burgoyne, has designed a series of informal discussions and exchange of science and ideas around topics selected as the most interesting and topical ones in the field. Invited speakers will give 10 minute introductions of a subject followed by discussion by a selected panel with audience participation actively encouraged. The extensive time for discussion sets this meeting apart from most that we attend. Moderators will facilitate questions from the audience to the speakers during their talks.

The Meeting will begin with our traditional welcoming reception on Wednesday, September 5, and the Scientific Conference will fill the three following days, concluding with a Gala Dinner on Saturday, September 8, 2012. Two Goldmann lectures will be included into the program, delivered by Elke Lütjen-Drecoll (Erlangen, Germany) and Paul Kaufman (Madison WI, USA) heading the respective scientific sessions. Our newly elected members will present or will participate as selected discussants so that we can get to know them better.

The GRS Meeting 2012 promises to be an exciting and interesting occasion for exchanging ideas and staying with friends.

We really hope you will enjoy the Meting and Würzburg atmosphere.

HALF DAY OPTIONAL TOUR IN WÜRZBURG

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 7

h. 14.15 - Meeting point at the Franconia Fountain in the Square in front of the Residenz for a special guided visit to the marvelous Würzburg "Residenz" (by Balthasar Neumann) and Tiepolo's paintings.

h. 15.15 - Bus transfer to the former Fortress Marienberg, one of Germany's biggest fortifications. Short stroll around the main buildings and stop in a beautiful beer garden for a short rest under old trees enjoying the view over Würzburg's valley including the renowned vineyard of "Stein". The guests will have the opportunity to drink a cup of coffee or a glass of local beer.

h. 16.30 - Visit to the massive battery fort of "Maschiculi Tower" (normally closed to the public), another masterpiece of Balthasar Neumann which impresses the visitors with its huge, stunnning vaultings, sunny terraces and underground battlements.

h. 17.15 - A slow panoramic walk downhill will bring back to the old town centre crossing the famous "Alte Mainbrücke" (Bus will be available as well).

Full day excursion to the Franconian countryside "Unknown Beauties"

- 9.45 Departure by bus from Franconia Fountain in the Square in front of the Residence for a trip to the famous loop of river Main, enjoying the beautiful landscape and the astonishing 180 degrees' bending of the Main at Volkach.
- 10.45 Stop at the panoramic point "Vogelsburg" to admire wonderful landscape.
- 11.30 Visit of the romantic pilgrimage church of "Our Lady in the vineyards" close to Volkach, where a renowned masterpiece of late gothic woodcarving is preserved: "Madonna in the Rosary" by Tilman Riemenschneider (1460-1531).

- 14.30 Ride across the vineyards to a small hidden castle at Zeilitzheim (visit to house and garden guided by the owner, Lady von Halem). In the castle there are interesting unknown paintings by the Italian painter F. Marchini, a pupil of Andrea Pozzo.
- 15.45 On the way back to Würzburg we shall see one of the most outstanding country parish churches of the famous Baroque architect Balthasar Neumann (1687-1753) at Gaibach.
- 17.30 Arrival in Würzburg (stops at Hotel Rebstock and Novotel).

Cost per person VAT included Euro 90,00 (bus, English speaking guide, lunch and entrance tickets incl.).


SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 2012
